	Description: This session addresses Internet openness including censorship practices from a human rights perspective. Some legislations and practices in the Arab Countries are enforced to allegedly protect national security and defend against terrorism. The panel in this session will explore the extent to which these practices infringe on the rights of end users versus the government's responsibility to protect its citizens, and will attempt to balance between these two interests.			
	Questions that will be addressed include: Should there be, and how to develop, a regulatory framework that respects and protects users' rights – including offline rights such as the right to secure livelihoods? "Should online content and access to it be regulated by special laws? Is the end user's right to access and produce content absolute? What should the role of social platforms like Facebook and Twitter when it comes to regulating speech?
