ORDER

UPON a case management teleconference having been held this day with counsel for the parties in the two above-noted actions to address the scheduling of the Defendants' proposed motions to strike in both matters;

AND UPON hearing submissions on behalf of the parties;

AND UPON being advised by counsel for the Defendants, the Minister of Transport, Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada, the Attorney General of Canada, and the Director General Rail Safety (collectively the "Federal Defendants") that the Federal Defendants are withdrawing their request to bring motions to strike in both actions at this time;

AND UPON being further advised that the Federal Defendants seek an order to extend the time for filing their Statement of Defence in both actions to 30 days after the issuance of the Court's decision on the other Defendants' motions to strike;

AND UPON noting the Plaintiffs' consent to the proposed timeline for the filing of the Federal Defendants' Statement of Defence;

AND UPON noting that counsel for the Plaintiffs submitted proposed Amended Statements of Claim to the Court in each action under cover of letter dated September 6, 2022;

AND UPON the parties being agreed that the Plaintiffs may file the proposed Amended Statements of Claim as of right pursuant to Rule 200 of the *Federal Courts Rules* ("Rules");

AND UPON noting that the parties have agreed to the staggered timetable proposed by counsel for the Plaintiffs in correspondence dated September 2, 2022 for the delivery and filing of motion materials and the hearing of the motion to strike by the Defendant, Canadian National Railway ("CNR's Motion to Strike") and the motion to strike by Canadian Pacific Railway ("CPR's Motion to Strike") (collectively, the "Railways' Motions to Strike");

AND UPON the Court advising the parties that, given the overlap between the impugned pleadings and the proposed motions to strike in both actions, the Court prefers to have one timetable and one hearing date for the Railways' Motions to Strike;

AND UPON counsel for the Plaintiffs confirming that the Plaintiffs do not anticipate making any further amendments to their pleadings in either action at this time. Accordingly, the Railways' Motions to Strike will be based on the Plaintiffs' Amended Statements of Claim;

THIS COURT ORDERS that:

1. The timetable for the service and filing of motion materials in the CPR's Motion to Strike set out in paragraphs 1 to 5 of the Order dated August 3, 2022 remains in full force and effect. Paragraph 6 of the August 3rd Order is amended in accordance with paragraph 3 of this Order.

- 2. The timetable for the service and filing of motion materials in the CNR's Motion to Strike shall be the same as for the CPR's Motion to Strike, namely that:
 - (a) The Defendant CNR shall serve (but not file) its notice of motion and any supporting affidavit evidence by November 14, 2022;
 - (b) The responding parties on the motion shall serve (but not file) any responding affidavit evidence by December 14, 2022;
 - (c) The parties shall complete any cross-examinations on affidavits by January 31, 2023;
 - (d) The Defendant CNR shall serve and file its complete motion record, in accordance with Rule 364 of the *Rules*, along with proof of service, by February 21, 2023; and
 - (e) The responding parties shall serve and file their complete motion records, in accordance with Rule 365 of the *Rules*, along with proof of service, by March 14, 2023.
- 3. The hearing of the Railways' Motions to Strike shall take place at a special sitting of the Federal Court on Tuesday, April 11, 2023 at 9:30 a.m. MST for a duration of four (4) days. Unless otherwise directed by the Court, the hearing shall proceed as a hybrid hearing with counsel for the Plaintiffs and counsel for the Defendants CPR and CNR appearing in person at the Federal Court, 3rd Floor, 635-8th Ave. S.W., Calgary, Alberta and counsel for the Federal Defendants appearing by videoconference.

4. The Federal Defendants are granted leave to serve and file their Statement of Defence in both of the actions within 30 days after the date of the Order(s) disposing of the other Defendants' Motions to Strike.
